Censorship – An Information War is Raging. Our Liberty is at Stake.



There is an information war that is taking place right now in America. The social media platforms of Twitter, Facebook, YouTube and the search engine Google, along with major media of ABC, CBS, NBC, MSNBC, and now FOX News, are censoring free speech. Ohio Christian Alliance and Christian Alliance of America, along with a number of conservative groups and political campaigns, have had their messages censored and ad requests denied repeatedly over the last two election cycles. The Ohio Christian Alliance is a non-partisan

organization. We do not publicly endorse or support any political party or candidate, yet Facebook has denied the OCA and CAA in both 2018 and 2020 from running a promotional ad for our state and national voter guides. After the 2018 Election, we brought our concerns to the attention of members of Congress and the U.S. Senate. Some Congressional hearings were held, as they brought in the CEOs of the big tech companies, Mark Zuckerberg of Facebook, Jack Dorsey of Twitter, and Sundar Pichai of Google. However, nothing was done to truly correct the problem. Now those same members of Congress are experiencing censorship in their own political campaigns, to their chagrin.

Many people are upset with FOX News right now and have turned off their TV sets. Once a reliable alternative to the liberal major media, FOX has now become one of them.

THIS ELECTION IS NOT OVER. The President and his legal team are tracking down serious reports and documentation of election fraud in various battleground states that will make this election much closer. The smoking gun is the Dominion voting system that was used in 24 states, including some of the battleground states. The premature announcement by FOX News, the AP, and others, that Joe Biden had won the election is just that – premature.

Ohio Attorney General Dave Yost has filed an amicus brief with the U.S. Supreme Court to overturn the ruling that extended the deadline for absentee ballots in Pennsylvania. On November 8, the Michigan legislature held a rare emergency session to investigate possible election irregularities. Whistle blowers are coming forward across the country who worked in boards of elections, and sworn affidavits are being secured as evidence for the court cases. What other video, documentation, or electronic transmission evidence that legal teams are amassing is yet unknown. What is known is that the information is being suppressed by major media and social platforms of Facebook, Twitter, YouTube, and Google.

Conservatives have soured on FOX News, as they no longer trust it to be a reliable source, but are instead acting more like the other mainstream media. The FOX News decision desk was led by a well-known Democratic operative Arnon Mishkin who had worked on several Democratic campaigns. Conservatives who tuned in on the night of the election were stunned and angered that FOX News would not call obvious states for Trump, but went out of their way to call early states for Joe Biden. When the dust settled, conservatives had enough; they are leaving FOX News in droves. They are finding alternative media sources such as Newsmax, One News Now, OAN, Knewz, Breitbart, CBN, and Epoch Times, as well as Dennis Prager, Mark Levin, Dan Bongino, Dinesh D'Souza, Diamond and Silk, and The Blaze. **The Ohio Christian Alliance is urging its members to move to Parler as one option for free uncensored communication.**

What this means is that there is a revolution underway with conservatives getting their message out in different ways. The Ohio Christian Alliance is using its email list, text messaging, and phone announcements. New social platforms will be utilized as they become available. We will be leaving Twitter and eventually Facebook. You can always reach us at our websites of www.ohioca.org and www.CAAmerica.org. On this Veterans Day, the gift of prayer to our veterans as a lasting tribute to their sacrifice and service.

The Mall in Washington contains monument displays as enduring tributes to our war veterans and those who served us in time of peace, helping to keep America safe and free. As you walk around Washington D.C., you see many statues representing our Civil War veterans who helped to save the Union.

The Vietnam Veterans Memorial, known as “The Wall,” is a solemn reminder of those who served and died in the Vietnam War. The Korean War Memorial on the opposite end of The Mall is a tribute to those veterans who served us in what is known as “The Forgotten War.” And then, there is the WWII Memorial that stands between the Lincoln Memorial and the Washington Monument, honoring the 16 million Americans that served us in WWII. With its Pacific and Atlantic arches, and pillars that honor each of the states and U.S. Territories from which the veterans served, it stands as a fitting tribute to that Great Generation of Americans who answered the call to fight against tyranny in Europe and in the Pacific.

The WWII Memorial that was dedicated in 2004 did not have a prayer, a scripture verse, or a reference to God anywhere on it. In 2011, the Ohio Christian Alliance encouraged members of the U.S. House of Representatives and the U.S. Senate to introduce legislation to add FDR’s D-Day Landing Prayer in its entirety at the WWII Memorial. S 1044, sponsored by U.S. Senator Rob Portman, passed by unanimous consent in the U.S. Senate on the eve of the 70th Anniversary of the D-Day Landings. On June 30, 2014, President Obama signed the bill into law. The legislation stipulated that the Prayer’s addition would not be paid for by tax dollars, but by private donations.



Over the past six years since the bill’s signing, the Ohio Christian Alliance with the Friends of the WWII Memorial has been working on raising the funding for the Prayer’s addition. Small donations came in from across the country from veterans and family members of veterans for the prayer’s inclusion at the WWII Memorial. The overall project is between \$2 million and \$3 million, and now we can report that a major grant has been provided for the Prayer’s inclusion. What remains is the final design and construction, with a

dedication date of June 2022. So, on this Veterans Day, we at the Ohio Christian Alliance and the Christian Alliance of America are pleased to say thank you to all of our veterans. **Now by God’s grace, we are able to fulfill the promise we made. This wonderful historic Presidential Prayer that FDR prayed with the nation on the evening of the D-Day Landings will now be a permanent addition at the WWII Memorial as a lasting tribute to these veterans for their sacrifice and service for the cause of liberty.**

The Ohio Christian Alliance and the Christian Alliance of America will be working on the final design and construction phase of the D-Day Prayer Project with the Friends of the WWII Memorial as it works its way through the Fine Arts and U.S. Capital Planning Commission approvals. We will also be working on an educational program with historians Bill Federer, Dave Barton, and others. We are raising a budget for this national educational program to highlight the addition of the D-Day Prayer at the WWII Memorial.

OCA will continue its work at the Ohio Statehouse on important election reform legislation, safeguarding Ohio's vote for future elections.
