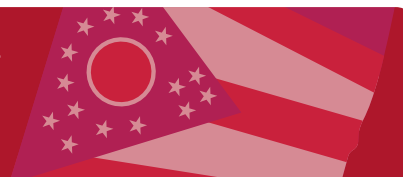

- REASON 1** Issue 1 makes possession of any amount of deadly drugs nothing more than a misdemeanor, and forbids jail sentencing for the first two offenses, no matter what quantities of drugs are involved.
- REASON 2** Issue 1 significantly damages Ohio's economy and our job development efforts. Ohio would be alone among states in our region with ultraliberal Issue 1 drug laws – at a time when Ohio employers already complain that they can't find workers who can pass drug tests. Issue 1 will drive jobs from Ohio.
- REASON 3** Issue 1 puts Ohio drug law in the Constitution where it can be changed only through lengthy process and vote of the electorate. Ohio will be unable to respond rapidly to any new drug threat.
- REASON 4** Issue 1 will flood Ohio's streets with drugs. With all deterrent gone except for traffic-violation level fines, possessors of drugs will laugh at police knowing they cannot be jailed.
- REASON 5** Issue 1 enables the immediate release of as many as 10,000 felony offenders from Ohio prisons into our communities.*
