This layout depicts the draft design of the prayer's placement as approved by the Fine Arts Commission.

In November of 2016, a hearing was held by the Commission of Fine Arts in Washington, D.C. concerning the architectural design and placement of FDR's D-Day Prayer at the National WWII Memorial. Site selection was approved in October of last year for the area just outside of the Atlantic Arch, an area designated as the "Circle of Remembrance". Originally part of the WWII Memorial monument and grounds, the site is currently rustic and undeveloped.

The architectural design calls for granite flooring and benches to be constructed to complete the development of the Circle of Remembrance in conjunction with the WWII Memorial. FDR's prayer will be included as part of this enhancement. The entire text of the prayer will be displayed on four bronze plaques placed upon a granite tabletop. The 545-word prayer will be a permanent addition to the National WWII Memorial in Washington D.C.

The prayer's placement will not be paid for by tax dollars, but by private citizen contributions. The projected cost of the overall project is \$2 million. This includes the Circle of Remembrance enhancement, where the prayer will be prominently placed. Contributions earmarked for this project can be made to the Ohio Christian Alliance Ed Fund as a tax-deductible donation. We rejoice in the great accomplishment that God has granted us in adding the D-Day Landing Prayer as a permanent addition to the WWII Memorial in Washington, D.C. to honor all our veterans, past and present.
